## **Funders for Surrey Heath**

### **• Surrey Heath Community Fund Grant Scheme**

The Council has its own Community Grant Fund from which it provides grants of up to £25,000 to assist local 'not for profit organisations' with the delivery of community projects.

To qualify for a grant from the Community Grant Fund applications must fit with the Council's objectives from our 2020 Strategy a copy of which is available from their website <http://www.surreyheath.gov.uk/council/councilinformation/corporateplan.htm> and must demonstrate benefit to the local community or a section of it.

Grants are available for amounts up to £25,000. The Council will consider grant applications below £2,000 and will pay up to 75% of the project cost; and applications between £2,001-£25,000 and will pay up to 50% of project costs.

Application deadlines are twice a year on 30th June and 31st December. Applications received after these dates will not be considered until the following application round. Decisions on whether applications have been successful are made in Nov/Dec (1st round) and May/June (2nd round) by the Executive Committee.

### **• Safer Surrey Heath Partnership**

Surrey Heath is one of the safest boroughs in one of the safest counties in England. Nevertheless, the Partnership recognises that there are things we can all do to make the area an even safer place to live, work and visit.

The Partnership welcomes funding applications from community and voluntary groups for one-off community safety projects that meet one or more of its Partnership Action Plan objectives.

When submitting a bid, applicants must show how their project will help achieve Partnership Action Plan objectives and demonstrate how funds will be utilised. Information on target audience, geographical area covered and timescale of projects are also required.

Successful bidders must submit quarterly reports as well as an evaluation after 12 months to demonstrate their project's impact on community safety. Evidence of expenditure is also a condition of funding.
