Funders for Tandridge

Tandridge District Council Small grants scheme

The Small Grants Scheme seeks to support a range of local voluntary organisations (eg care charities, arts groups, sports clubs and youth groups). It offers modest contributions to help with:

- Running costs (care groups only).
- Specific projects (£3,000 maximum per award although, in practice, grants tend to be limited to below £1,000).

The following are not eligible

- Organisations with no tangible presence in the district
- Commercial organisations
- Schools
- Parish or village councils
- Individuals.

Projects must benefit Tandridge residents and should not conflict with the Council's corporate objectives. Both applicant organisations and their proposed projects must be financially viable. The Council must not be the sole contributor (ie funding should also come from the organisation itself and/or other sources).

Grants for specific projects

All types of voluntary organisation can apply for these grants.

As stated within the criteria, requests for assistance with the following types of project will be considered:

- Performances (eg concerts and theatrical productions).
- Start up activities.
- Initiatives that extend or enhance the activities already being undertaken.

Grants will not be provided for the direct provision of vehicles or structural improvements to premises.

Tandridge Community Fund

The Tandridge Community Fund (TCF) a charitable fund specifically for the benefit of Tandridge district and its residents. The TCF has been set up in partnership with the Community Foundation for Surrey to offer a fund that enables and encourages local giving so that as a district we can develop a greater capacity to respond to local issues.



What's the need?

- Support for older residents – due to restricted access to transport and basic services, our older residents are often in danger of isolation. The fund will support projects to reduce this isolation such as events and activities.
- Facilities & training, skills and experience for young people – Providing funding support towards youth clubs such as funding activities, equipment, expeditions, Scouts & Guides
- Community Facilities – improving access and services at community focal points
- Preserving our heritage and environment – supporting projects that improve our heritage, culture and environment

What the TCF can offer?

A Management Panel makes grants out of the income from the TCF to support people, projects and activities within our community as long as they meet the Fund criteria.

Grants will fund both existing services or facilities and new initiatives and can contribute to either capital costs such as funding new equipment or supporting ongoing running costs. Each year the TCF Panel, working with the Community Foundation for Surrey will set specific criteria to reflect the current needs of the community.
